The South Carolina Governor's School for Science & Mathematics (GSSM) is an educational leader enabling and nurturing future leaders for South Carolina and beyond. GSSM is a public high school for academically talented juniors and seniors from across the state with residential, virtual, and outreach curricula. Established in 1988, GSSM provides opportunities for intellectual development beyond the scope of a traditional high school. Rising juniors apply for admission through a rigorous selection process, including an essay, standardized test scores and interviews, as well as external and internal application reviews.

**GSSM's mission is to seek out and advance our state's most talented and motivated students, offering a transforming education in science, mathematics, and engineering that cultivates joy in learning and builds the confidence to engage as ethical leaders with the world's most significant issues.**

GSSM is a member and represented on the Board of Directors of the National Consortium of Secondary STEM Schools (NCSSS) and is a member of the National Association for College Admission Counseling (NACAC) and The College Board.

### ACADEMICS

By combining rigorous STEM, humanities, and social sciences courses, extended field trips, intensive 2–3 hour science labs, and mentored research, GSSM fosters a student's ability to think critically, to apply theory, and to develop ideas independently. The small faculty-student ratio allows GSSM instructors to provide individualized attention to encourage students to reach their full potential. GSSM's schedule mirrors that of a traditional college. The students are held to high standards with classes being taught at a college level. GSSM also subscribes to a rigorous grading system. Many of our students exhaust AP offerings and elect to take courses that are taught above the AP level. In our STEM departments, 23 out of the 50 courses (46%) are considered above AP, which means they require an AP course as a prerequisite or there is no AP course sanctioned by College Board in that area. Due to the rigorous nature of GSSM's core curriculum, our students take on average two above AP level electives; less than 12% of GSSM students take five or more above AP level electives.

GSSM has memorandums of understanding with Clemson University and the University of South Carolina to grant college credit for university approved GSSM courses that are closely aligned with the university's courses.

### SUMMER PROGRAM FOR RESEARCH INTERNS

During the summer following their junior year, all GSSM students spend six weeks conducting research under the guidance of professional researchers at universities, field sites, and industry partners across the state, nation, and world through the GSSM Summer Program for Research Interns and its international complement, the Research Experience Scholars Program. Through participation in this distinctive research program, GSSM students gain direct experience and develop practical understanding of research methods, familiarity with the methods of discovery, content knowledge, critical thinking skills, data analysis and quantitative skills, and communication skills. Research sites include Clemson University, College of Charleston, Medical University of South Carolina, University of South Carolina, MIT, and Southern University—Baton Rouge, as well as international sites in China, Germany, and South Korea.

During their senior year, students work with their GSSM faculty research advisor to develop a complete research portfolio describing their experience. They present their research at the GSSM Annual Research Colloquium and the South Carolina Junior Academy of Science annual meeting. GSSM students may also have the opportunity to present their research at professional conferences or submit it to an academic journal in conjunction with their summer research mentor.

### JANUARY INTERIM

For three weeks before the second semester begins, students at GSSM participate in a "mini-mester," or January Interim, during which they focus on one experiential course. Interim classes provide a wide variety of course offerings that allow students to tap into undiscovered talents and explore new hobbies. Several courses include travel and field experiences, and there are typically two or more international and one or more in-country trips offered. In years past, groups have visited places like Silicon Valley and the Galapagos Islands. Course topics are diverse and include science, technology, art, music and drama.



## GRADING SCALE

All high schools in South Carolina are required to utilize the South Carolina Uniform Grading Scale. Only grades of C or higher are given credit at GSSM. Additional weighting is given for grades earned in Honors, AP, and Dual Enrollment. The GPAs provided include all courses listed on the transcript, including courses posted from 8<sup>th</sup> grade.

### DISCIPLINARY REPORTING POLICY

## Campus Life

All students are required to live on campus and are encouraged to become involved in various co-curricular activities. Engagement in the co-curricular is viewed by GSSM as essential to the holistic experience of all students. Be it through leadership, club participation, or community service, it is expected that all students will be involved to some degree in the life of the school beyond their academic pursuits.

The residential program is based on a House System where each of the six floors in the residence hall represents a house: Praesidium, Fidelitas, Lux, Veritas, Libertatum, and Fortem. The houses are led by House Captains, who are selected from among their peers, and six full-time live-in professional staff members who hold bachelor's or master's degrees. The staff members provide developmental co-curricular programs based on the residential programming model: Academic Support, Health and Wellness, Cultural Competency, Leadership Development, Interpersonal Development, and Intrapersonal Development.

As a response to the State of South Carolina for this opportunity, the local community for their gracious support of the school, and each other as a demonstration of citizenship, students are encouraged to support the campus, local, and South Carolina communities to encourage institutional values through the community engagement program (community service). Over the years, students have been encouraged to design and develop projects related to their personal interests, passions, and community needs. Some of them include:
